Andrea L. Caladie of Parente Randolph Appointed to AICPA Committee

PHILADELPHIA, PA – October 9, 2007 – Andrea L. Caladie, CPA, Principal In Charge of Parente Randolph’s Public Sector practice, has been appointed to the Private Companies Practice Section (PCPS) Technical Issues Committee (TIC) of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA).

The TIC was established by the AICPA to monitor and comment on technical developments that could significantly affect private companies and the public accounting firms that serve them. Almost 6,000 of these firms are represented by the PCPS, an AICPA sponsored body that represents and provides practice management resources to local and regional firms. Caladie, whose term is 3 years, serves in Zone 3 on the committee which addresses Governmental Accounting Standards.
